I give thanks for you this season and appreciate all your gratitude shared for me during Pastor Appreciation Month! This month I give thanks for all of *you*, especially our council and committees, staff, and the many people who do unseen tasks around the church and community and lead our many ministries. I am grateful for our ministry together.

As we enter a season of giving thanks, we also know that this is a season of heightened anxiety and dread for many. Not only is it election season but also the start of the busy holiday season, too. This time of year can be difficult as holidays may bring up reminders of our grief and loss, those who will not be present with us to celebrate Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas. In the midst of everything going on in the world and our own lives, Professor Benjamin Stewart of the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago asks "How can we live in hope and integrity when it looks like the end of the world?" (Prof. Benjamin Stewart, "All Saints Day", *Living Lutheran*, 2022.) Well, we begin this season with a beautiful, hopeful and important holiday in the church- All Saints' Day. This is a day that invites us to remember all the saints who have gone before us, and remember that we, too, are a part of the company of the saints formed in Christ Jesus. Professor Stewart says All Saints' Day is a holiday of hope: "All Saints reimagines the world—all of it. Even in death, God is making all things new."

In worship on Sunday, November 3rd, we will gather with all the saints and share in the meal of Holy Communion, giving us a foretaste of the feast to come. We will also remember church members who have died within the past year: Jerald Heeran, Lois McDowell, Terry West and Donald Henrichs. You will be invited to light candles to remember family, friends, and community members who have died. If you worship at home, I encourage you to light your own candle in honor of the saints you remember this day. Candles serve as a symbol of light and hope in the midst of darkness and remind us that Jesus is the "light of the world" (John 8:12).

Let us enter this season bringing our anxiety and hope, our doubt and our fear, our joy and sorrow, our sinner and saint selves to the table of grace, remembering that Christ's death and resurrection has formed us all into the company of saints and we are promised new life in Christ.

What are you grateful for this season? What anxieties, fear, or grief do you lift to God this day? Who do you remember on All Saints' Day?



Secretary's Report: September minutes were reviewed. Motioned by Aimee, second by Jeremy to approve the Secretary's report. All ayes. Motion car-

ried. Jim discussed some updates the bank needs from the August minutes. Leslie suggested taking action on those updates today, so they are referenced in this month's minutes for the bank.
