Welcome back to school! The start of September is an exciting and busy time, especially for students and families. I pray God's presence meets all our educators, students and families with each backpack zip, pen click, and school bell ring. On Sept. 8 we will have "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday. Please join us for a short communion worship in the Parish Hall at 9am, followed by service projects. There will be tasks for all ages! The week after that we will kick-off the program year on Rally Sunday, Sept. 15. Join us for worship at 9:00am, followed by Sunday School at 10:00am. After worship, our fellowship time will include "Tell Your Story." Stay for coffee, treats, and a Q&A with one of our members.

As we begin a new program year, we will also begin a new sermon series. 

St. James Council Meeting Minutes - August 2024

Meeting was called to order at 5:38 p.m. by Jim Davies. Present: Leslie Groen, Amanda Wehren, Aimee Deuell, Mystie Hummel, Danny Bohlen, Jason Shaull, Taylor Salge, Financial Administrator Mindy Pecha and Pastor Rebecca Baird. Devotions given by Danny Bohlen.

# **REPORTS**:

Treasurer's report was provided by Mindy prior to the meeting. June income was \$299,494.60 with \$10, 470.98 being regular income and \$289,023.62 from the sale of the parsonage and total expenses of \$11,311.80. Motioned by Jim, second by Aimee to approve the Treasurer's report. All ayes. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: July minutes were reviewed. Motioned by Mystie, second by Amanda to approve the Secretary's Report. All ayes. Motion carried.

Standing Committee Reports:

Stewardship and Finance: The committee met prior to the Board meeting to discuss proceeds of the parsonage sale and starting a capital campaign for the new roof. The committee recommended the following with the parsonage proceeds: 1. Transfer \$30,000 back into the checking account as a reimbursement of what was spend on the parsonage kitchen, 2. Leave \$62,000 in savings to have on hand for the down payment on the roof, split the remaining funds into a few CD with varying duration and interest rates.

Property Committee: The new outside steps by the kitchen have been installed. Discussed signing the roof contract now vs. later. Motioned by Jason to sign and submit the roof contract, second by Mystie. All ayes. Motion carried.

Education/Youth Ministry: They meet this month and Scott Bruns and Amy Wubbena will be teaching 5<sup>th</sup> grade Sunday School. LOL and confirmation will begin again on September 18<sup>th</sup> and Rally Sunday for Sunday school classes will be on September 15<sup>th</sup>. Mystie Hummel will be helping with Luther League and Pastor has only more 'Play on the Playground' day in August and had 11 in attendance.

Worship & Music: They are making plans and Pastor Rebecca is working on a sermon series called "You don't hear that in Sunday school."

Evangelism: They met and discussed Food & Fellowship starting up again this fall with August 21<sup>st</sup> being the first and a Family Fun Night. God's Work, Our Hands needs ideas for projects and Evangelism will be participating in the Harvest Moon Festival at Wilder's Park and Trunk or Treat in Allison.

Pastor's Report: Pastor shared recent and upcoming activities including several visits to sick or hospitalized members. She also had her first wedding on August 3<sup>rd</sup> and two funerals. She also wanted to share that all the local pastors have collectively put a policy in place for the Good Samaritan Fund.

Old Business: Volunteers for LOL are still needed, Mystie will be helping Pastor Rebecca with Luther League and they will meet on the first Wednesday of the month. The council already moved on signing the roof contract.

New Business:

Council reviewed the Stewardship & Finance recommendations for the proceeds from the sale of the church parsonage. Motioned by Aimee, second by Danny to direct Mindy Pecha to take the following actions:

- Transfer \$30,000 from savings to checking as reimbursement for the parsonage kitchen.
- Transfer \$62,000 into a 9-month CD

Transfer \$60,000 into a 12-month CD

Transfer \$60,000 into a 15-month CD

Leave approximately \$102,000 in savings with \$62,000 earmarked for the down payment of the roof contract.

The council also discussed beginning a "Raise the Roof" capital campaign including the possibility of using pledge cards, temple talk and discussing other ways to reach out to the congregation for financial support.

Council reviewed bank accounts and approved the following authorized signer changes:

Motioned by Leslie, second by Jason to update the Sunday School Account ending in 7359 authorized signers to be Alyssa Endelman and Mystie Hummer and we wish to remove Kendrick and Lindsey Renken. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motioned by Leslie, second by Jason to update the Community Bible School Account ending in 7595 authorized signers to be Daleth Pothast and Taylor Salge and we wish to remove Pastor Jeffrey Blank and Robin Morton. All ayes. Motion carried.

Council discussed ideas for adult fellowship including a potluck and starting an adult Bible study a few times per month. Pastor will also be continuing the "Tell your Story" and is need of new volunteers to tell their story. Syd will be sending a letter out to update church membership records and Jim asked about getting a new church directory.

Motioned to adjourn made by Mystie, seconded by Danny. Meeting adjourned 6:24 p.m. Next meeting will be held August 14<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 p.m.
